WHAT: Live displays of venomous and non-venomous snakes, including a two-headed snake, will be on exhibit at the Mississippi Museum of Natural Science from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m. and experts will be available to answer questions about Mississippi snakes.

In addition, biologist Terry Majure will explain how to identify venomous and non-venomous snakes and provide accurate natural history information on our native snakes and their valuable place in the ecosystem during two lectures from 10:00 am – 11:00 am and Noon – 1:00 pm.
