June 5, 2010 – January 9, 2011

The 60-foot, 2-million-year-old Megalodon looms life-size in this mega-exhibit of modern and fossil sharks! This traveling exhibit highlights the evolution, biology and misconceptions of Megalodon, an enormous prehistoric shark that once cruised all the world's oceans. Related to the modern great white and mako sharks, Megalodon was a dominant marine predator for 15 million years before vanishing 2 million years ago. The exhibit explores fossil sharks as ambassadors for science and shark conservation. Be consumed with awe, walk away with respect!



February 5, 2011 – May 8, 2011

Amazing Butterflies, created by The Natural History Museum in London in collaboration with Minotaur Mazes, invites you to shrink down into the undergrowth to become one of the most extraordinary creatures on earth. Visitors enter the interactive maze through the huge monarch caterpillar tunnel. Become a caterpillar and find your way through a secret, wild world as grass and leaves tower above your head. Together, groups will explore this interactive maze experience and learn the surprising challenges butterflies face every day.
